We are two visual artists who have been mixing painting and sculpture with textiles and embroidery since 2017. The result of this creative contamination process has its roots in the tension that is created in the exact balance between the two of us.

The full enjoyment of our work requires the creation of immersive worlds in which the viewer can experience the spirit behind our work. We try to stimulate as many senses as possible in order to detach the viewer's mind from the present and to lead them to an inner vision that permits a different perception of individual stimuli.

Our research is based on various aspects of universal and social memory, aiming to examine the influences that affect our lives. This begins with an analysis of the mechanisms and implications of these forces in the subconscious - including dreams, esotericism, instincts, religion and magic - and continues with the study of the endless struggle between life and death, science and mysticism, materiality and spirituality.

As our interest is strongly directed towards the human being, we focus our attention on the relationship between society and individual obsessions, fears and passions, trying to study how everything exists in a tense relationship with its opposite.

FANGO is a project by Studio Atzori created for the spaces of the Manufacture. Conceived as a life-size diorama, the installation reconstructs a village square populated by ordinary figures absorbed in everyday gestures. Sculpted in fabric and epoxy clay, these characters form a suspended fragment of reality where apparent normality conceals tensions, hierarchies, and subtle power dynamics.

Drawing from the industrial history of Roubaix and the lives of its working communities, FANGO explores the most diffuse and invisible forms of power—those embedded in social roles, interpersonal relations, and the almost imperceptible gestures of daily life. A discreet yet omnipresent force that shapes behaviors and structures collective existence.







The installation includes about twenty sculptures of various ages and social positions, arranged in an immersive setting in which the viewer becomes part of the scene. Like mud that clings to everything it touches, power permeates each interaction.

FANGO becomes a collective mirror, inviting visitors to recognize how micro-powers circulate through society, subtly but profoundly shaping communal life.



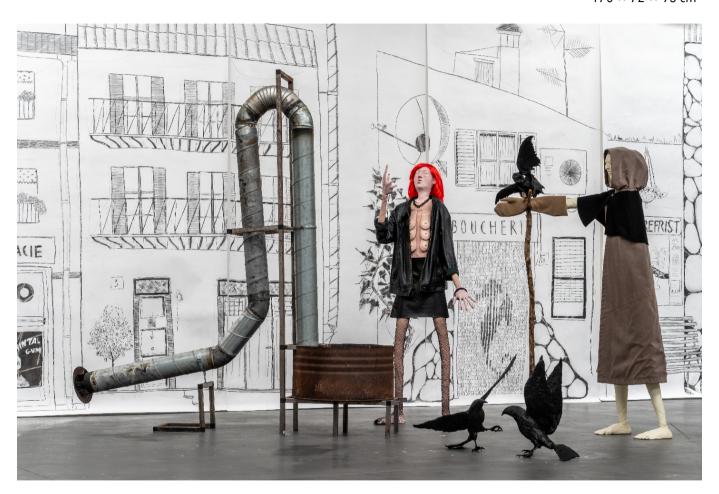

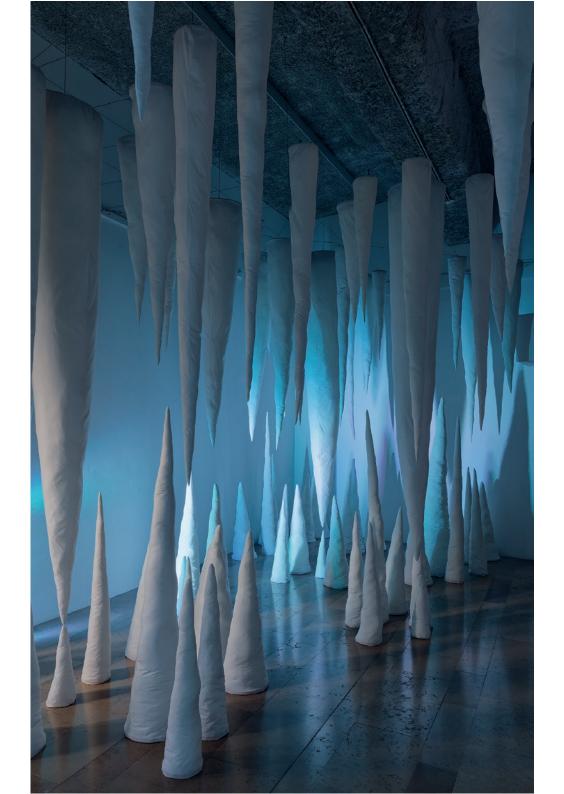

"DROP" is a site-specific project conceived for the Halle in Pont-en-Royans, France.

The history of the area and its geological formation inspired a reflection on the human perception of time.

The tenacity with which each impalpable drop of water contributes to shaping the form of a cave, challenging the human understanding of time necessary for such slow transformations, becomes a symbol of continuous resistance to an unavoidable superior force.

Every individual is constantly driven by the need to feel part of a group. This defines what is normal and right. Those who do not fit into this norm are labelled as different and therefore perceived as wrong.

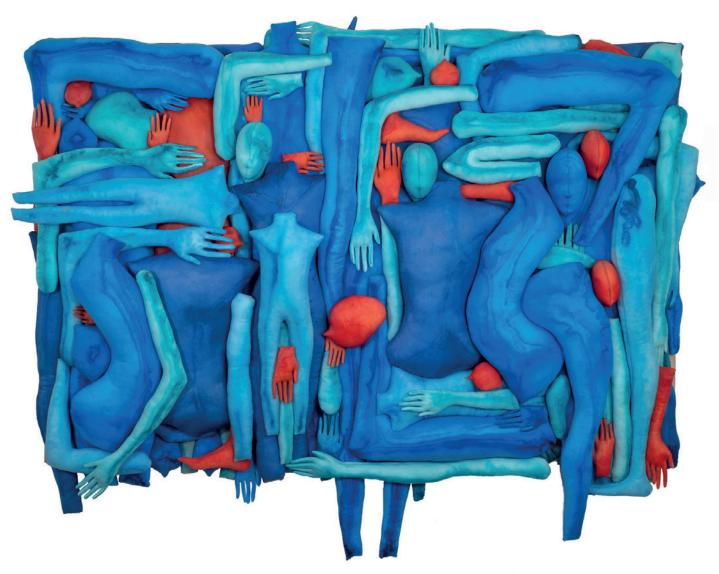

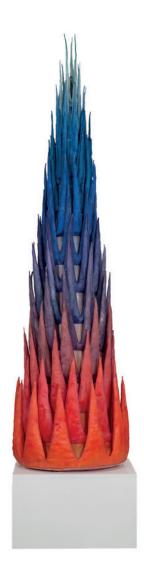

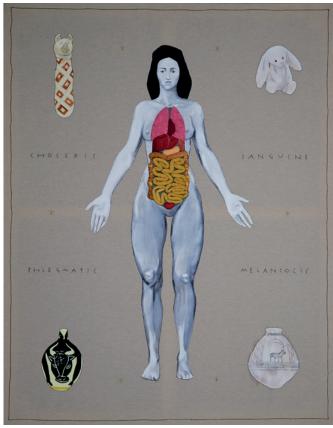
AMEN is a multi-sensory experience created in the former Sonart recording studio (Brussels). The entire production was conceived around the theme of personal memory and universal symbols.

It was a scenographic exhibition that invited the visitor to get lost within the process of creation itself, investigating how suggestions and personal attitude merge with instinct to bring objects to life. All the individual fragments seem individual, but when looking closer or perhaps taking a step back it becomes apparent that everything is interconnected, only when accepting that one is lost everything seems to reveal itself.

The exhibition consisted of a fabric labyrinth that led visitors through the various rooms while hiding the space that contained it all. Passing through a circus, a church, after passing through a modest dwelling where the artists' parents welcomed visitors by offering food and wine, only at the end did the wunderkammer reveal itself to the viewer.

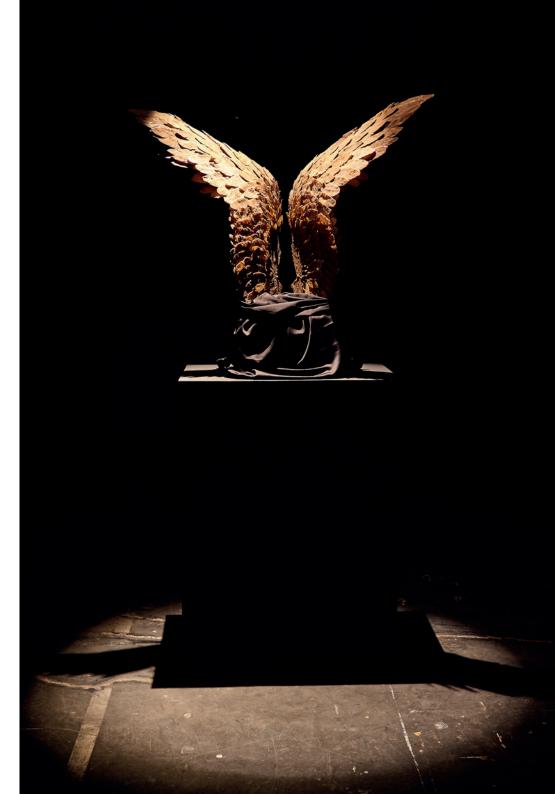
